English has become a widely spoken and used language and hence there is a great desire to communicate effectively in English—both in speech and writing. English has become the language for opportunities and empowerment.

The CBCS pattern of undergraduate curriculum adopted by the department asper UGC guidelines with effect from the academic year 2016-17 has propelled for syllabus change. The emphasis of the syllabus is to meet a variety of real-life communication needs such as: to give and seek information, to express opinions and to convey ideas and feelings. The topics selected equip the students to engage with practical, emotional, intellectual and creative aspects of language by integrating knowledge and skills.

The objective of this syllabus is to enhance the oral and written skills of the students and enable them to perform well in the academics.

The syllabus of the UG II Year - Semester III and IV Semester is reviewed and ratified.
