Learning to communicate in English effectively is crucial in our day to day lives. Hence the syllabus is designed to equip the students with the necessary language skills while acknowledging their critical thinking capabilities.

The CBCS pattern of undergraduate curriculum adopted by the department as per UGC guidelines with effect from the academic year 2016-17 has propelled for syllabus change. The Reorganised CBCS pattern of the three-year undergraduate curriculum is designed to address the specific needs of the final year students who are about to encounter the workings of the English language in the real world. However, the prescribed 'English in Action' has a significant new feature. Two units, one each in Semester V and VI, focusing on the theme of gender have been included in the syllabus to highlight the need for gender equality.

The committee members were satisfied and accepted three units for V Semester and VI Semester as the syllabus and approved the same. Grammar, Vocabulary and Writing skills to be taught as mentioned in the units of the Syllabus.

The paper is for 100 marks. As per the UGC new norms and guidelines the theory paper is set for 70 Marks where as the internal assessment is conducted for 30 marks. Each semester will be having two internals for 20 marks each. The average of the two will be taken into consideration. The remaining 10 marks are divided as following:

- * 5 Marks for Assignment
- * 5 Marks Seminar
